1. Attend Orientation Meeting	
2. Go to www.rotary.org and do the following: Select Club Finder on the horizontal menu. You can find Rotary clubs in any city or country. Browse the website to learn more about Rotary International.	
3. Go to <u>www.rotaryclubofboise.org</u> Choose Member Login ≥ Login Choose Member Area . Under My ClubRunner choose Edit My Profile . Complete your membership profile to include photo.	
4. Download and register for the ClubRunner app.	
5. Set up auto-pay for monthly dues.	
6. Be a greeter at TWO Rotary meetings. Just show up early and stand in the reception line.	
7. Join a committee. Visit with multiple committees to determine which one is right for you.	
8. Have lunch, coffee, or attend happy hour with a member to get to know them better.	
9. Sit with a different group each week to get to know more members.	

Optional:

- Attend a club social event.
- Attend a board meeting.
- Bring a guest to a Rotary Luncheon.. (Lunch is \$20/guest).
- Attend a different Rotary Club's meeting as a guest. All Rotary Clubs are unique and special.
- · Attend a Rotary Service project.
